### Acts 6:8-9:31 (Judea & Samaria)

- Stephen (6:8-8:3)
  - Powerful witness, arrest, defense, death
  - Burial by Christians; Persecution began
- Philip (8:4-40)
  - Powerful witness to Samaritans, Ethiopian eunuch, more
  - Peter & John come to "clean up" (gift of the Holy Spirit)
- Saul (9:1-31)
  - Stunning conversion & Ananias's support
  - Prophecy: carry Jesus' name to Gentiles and Jews, & suffer

#### Acts 9:19b-31

19b-22: Saul proclaimed the Lord Jesus Christ in Damascus

23-25: • Welcomed by Jewish Christians (a big step)

26-28: • Bold proclamation among Jews (synagogues)

• Jesus: human being who died, resurrected, our savior

29-30: • Lord: Son of God (having the same glory as God)

• Christ: Messiah, God's promised savior (fulfillment of the Jewish expectation for God's work)

• Power: Passion & proofs that could not be refuted

• People were amazed!

#### Acts 9:19b-31

19b-22: Saul proclaimed the Lord Jesus Christ in Damascus

23-25: Opponents tried to kill Saul; believers rescued him

26-28: • More to the story than Luke tells here (read Galatians, 2 Corinthians, and later in Acts)

29-30: • The identity of Jesus is a life-altering question

31: • Jesus is God over every people and every country

Not just an amazing person + great moral teaching

Though killing is not a good approach!

Saul has followers; they risked their lives to save him

  - 23-25: Opponents tried to kill Saul; believers rescued him
  - 26-28: Saul proclaimed the Lord Jesus Christ in Jerusalem, after Barnabas built the bridge to the church
  - 29-30: These were the people Saul had been arresting
    - 31: Disciples were still afraid of Saul
      - They doubted the sincerity of His conversion and legitimacy of his ministry
      - Problem of trust rather than information
      - Barnabas built a bridge
        - Son of "encouragement" (exhortation)

    - 31: The hunter became the hunted (like Stephen)
      - Those who hesitated to welcome Saul now took great risks to protect him
      - God (Acts 22:18) and people both guided Saul
      - Saul evangelized in his home area of Tarsus
        - Barnabas later recruited Saul for ministry together

- · Many people became a part of Jesus' church


