

36-38: • What did this look like?





- 31: Summary: Church enjoys peace and growth
- 32-34: Jesus heals paralyzed Aeneas through Peter
 - 35: Perhaps visiting new Christians (following Philip?)
- 36-38: Lydda & Joppa: Jewish towns in Gentile region
- 39-41: Aeneas: seems to be Greek-speaking Jew
- 42-43: A Christian?
 - Jesus' work at Peter's declaration

 - 35: Many people turn to Jesus
- 36-38: People turn to Jesus, not to Peter
- 39-41: Church is growing away from Jerusalem and the
- 42-43: temple
 - Belief is growing in Gentile areas

- 31: Summary: Church enjoys peace and growth
- 32-34: Jesus heals paralyzed Aeneas through Peter
 - 35: Many people turn to Jesus
- 36-38: Tabitha (Christian, good deeds) dies; people call Peter
- 39-41: Fits with Saul arresting women too
- 42-43: Her faith led her to help the poor
 - She is highly honored (Aeneas was not)
 - What do they want Peter to do?
 - 3-4 hour walk to get Peter
 - Burial may have come later that day
 - They feared Peter wouldn't come (2 witnesses)

- 31: Summary: Church enjoys peace and growth
- 32-34: Jesus heals paralyzed Aeneas through Peter
 - 35: Many people turn to Jesus
- 36-38: Tabitha (Christian, good deeds) dies; people call Peter
- 39-41: Jesus raises Tabitha to life through Peter
- 42-43: Tabitha's significant ministry to widows is stated again
 - Prayer expressed dependence upon God
 - Specific words are not the point
 - Rather: faith, and God's power and will
 - Amazing!

- 31: Summary: Church enjoys peace and growth
- 32-34: Jesus heals paralyzed Aeneas through Peter
 - 35: Many people turn to Jesus
- 36-38: Tabitha (Christian, good deeds) dies; people call Peter
- 39-41: Jesus raises Tabitha to life through Peter
- 42-43: Many more people believe in Jesus
 - Good for this news to travel, bringing more belief
 - Peter stays: maybe to help new believers grow
 - Peter stays with a <u>tanner</u> (not liked by Jews or Gentiles, often "unclean") → foreshadow

tanner = turn dead animal skins into leather

Application

- Re-see God's work and our work
 as a rich integration of human responsibility
 and God's sovereign action
 - Tabitha was the hands of Jesus to meet the needs of widows
 - Peter and believers joined by faith in the work of resurrection
 - We are not God!
 - Only He can raise a body or soul to life, or build the church
 - In God, we have power and authority
 - "When Jesus had called the Twelve together, **he gave them power and authority**...and he sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the sick." *Luke 9:1-2*
 - "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses..." Acts 1:8

Application

- Re-see God's work and our work
 as a rich integration of human responsibility
 and God's sovereign action
- · Take the risk of taking action
 - Head: when we can't reason it out
 - Heart: when our souls are running dry
 - Hands: when our strength is gone/our actions seem pointless
 - Our actions
 - Pray in faith → it is powerful, bringing God's actions
 - Obey in head, heart, and hands: miraculous & mundane
 - With seriousness (fear and trembling) and hope
 - God's work includes our work
 - Yet is not dependent upon our power or perfection

Application

- Re-see God's work and our work
 as a rich integration of human responsibility
 and God's sovereign action
- Take the risk of taking action
- Expect and recognize the work of God by faith
 - Ask / Seek / Knock → and God will work (in His ways)
 - Give praise to God, even when we see the direct means
 - Give thanks to people as God's instruments by faith
 - Some temptations we might face
 - Putting faith in people instead of God
 - Taking pride in people (or selves) instead of God
 - Focusing on limitations of people (us and others)
