
Authenticity

1 John

- A letter from the Apostle John (Jesus' closest friend)
- Wrote to people who were affected by false teaching
- John emphasized the reality of the Son of God becoming a human being, and the implications for those who trust Him
- ➤ When there is false teaching, love is often absent

1 John 4:13-21

We know we live in God and God in us when...

- 13-16a: We believe and depend upon Jesus as God's Son and our Savior
- 16b-21: We love other people as Jesus loved us
 - Continually gives of self to others and seeks their benefit even when they don't deserve it

"Reciprocal Indwelling"

- A shocking idea of close fellowship with God
 - "If what you heard from the beginning abides in you, then you too will abide in the Son and in the Father."

1 John 2:24

- "The one who keeps God's commands lives in him, and he in them."
- "We live in him and he is us" 1.70hn 4:13
- "God lives in them and they in God" 1 John 4:15
- "lives in God and God in them" 1 John 4:16

Reciprocal indwelling comes from God's Spirit being in us

Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again."

Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit."

The Fun (and challenge) of Language

- What is the "love of God"?
 - **Subjective**: God's love for people
 - **Objective**: People's love for God
- "Love of God Completed"
 - God's love for people
 is completed when
 people love God and people

No one has ever seen God; but <u>if we love one another</u>, <u>God lives</u> <u>in us</u> and his love is made complete in us.

1 John 4:12

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this <u>everyone will know that you are my disciples</u>, if <u>you love one another</u>." John 13:13

This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. 1 John 4:9


This is how love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment: In this world we are like Jesus.



Implications

- Believe and trust that Jesus is God, our Savior in the flesh
 - There are good reasons to believe, but in the end, belief is a moral choice
 - Trust is far more than intellectual knowledge
 - It is to **rely on Jesus as God** for our being

 - "It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs."

Implications

- Believe and trust that Jesus is God, our Savior in the flesh
- Love others with God's love
 - In this church
 - In other churches, "near and far"
 - People not in churches
 - "Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres."

Passive and Active

- This belief/trust and love must come from God: Passive
 - "This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."

1 John 4:10

- "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me."

Galatians 2:20

Passive and Active

- This belief/trust and love must come from God: Passive
- We are commanded to believe and to love: Active
 - "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me."
 John 14:1
 - "And he has given us this command: Anyone who loves God must also love their brother and sister." 1 John 4:21
