Context: John

- The book as a whole
 - Purpose: Evangelism
 - That is, help people become children of God through faith in Jesus of Nazareth as God
 - "These are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." John 20:30-31
 - Problem: Jesus isn't here anymore!

Context: John

- Chapter 13
 - 1-20: Jesus showed His love by serving as the least
 - His hour had come
 - All of his disciples, except one, were "clean"
 - One was going to "lift his heel against me" (betray)
 - Command: love each other
 - 21-30: Jesus was troubled that one of them will betray him
 - 31-35: Jesus was going to depart. He commanded love
 - 36-38: Jesus was going to depart. Peter would deny

Context: John

- Chapter 13
 - These were troubling events and words
 - Jesus' humility as lowly servant, yet He claimed to be God
 - Jesus kept talking about His departure
 - Jesus said that one of them would betray Him
 - Jesus said that Peter (most courageous) would deny Him

Troubled

- Literally: of water
 - Stirred up
 - Agitated
- Figuratively: of heart, soul, or spirit
 - Perplexed
 - Agitated
 - Disquieted
 - Upset

"However appropriate it may be to cite the words 'Do not let your hearts be troubled' at Christian funerals, they were first addressed to disciples who under substantial emotional pressure were on the brink of catastrophic failure."

Jesus experienced a troubled soul

- At Lazarus's (a close friend) funeral:
 - When Jesus saw [Lazarus's sister] weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in spirit and troubled.
- As Jesus anticipated His death
 - "Now my soul is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name!"

 John 12:27-28
- As Jesus thought about being betrayed by Judas
 - After he had said this, Jesus was troubled in spirit and testified,
 "Very truly I tell you, one of you is going to betray me." John 13:21


- 1-4: Have courage! Jesus will return to take us with Him to live with the Father forever
- 5-6: Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life
 - The only way to God the Father
- 7-11: To see Jesus is to see God
 - Mutual indwelling, shown by words and works
- 12-14: Christians will do greater works
 - As Jesus answers prayer
- 15-17: Central prayer: Holy Spirit in us forever
- 18-21: Welcomed into the love of God forever



- -The final result will be to live in God's love and presence forever, and Jesus Himself is the one who will bring us there
- To know Jesus is to know, and to be known by, the Godhead (Father, Son, and Spirit) even if it doesn't yet seem like it
