As for you, you were dead in your <u>transgressions</u> and sins, ² in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the <u>ruler of the kingdom of the air</u>, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. ³ All of us also lived among them at one time, <u>gratifying</u> the <u>cravings of our flesh</u> and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature deserving of <u>wrath</u>.

> transgressions = immoral actions and thoughts ruler of the kingdom of the air = Satan, who fights against God gratifying = indulging, giving in to desire cravings of the flesh = doing whatever one feels like wrath = just anger against wrongdoing

Ephesians 2:1-10 ⁴ But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, ⁵ made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in <u>transgressions</u>—it is by grace you have been saved. <u>transgressions = immoral actions and attitudes</u>

Ephesians 2:1-10

⁶ And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the <u>heavenly realms</u> in Christ Jesus, ⁷ in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his <u>grace</u>, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. ⁸ For it is by <u>grace</u> you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— ⁹ not by works, so that no one can boast. ¹⁰ For we are God's <u>handiwork</u>, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. <u>heavenly realms = in God's presence</u> grace = God's loving choice to forgive and restore people

handiwork = something God has made

Ephesians 2:8-10 ⁸ For it is by <u>grace</u> you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God-⁹ not by works, so that no one can boast. ¹⁰ For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. grace = God's loving choice to forgive and restore people handiwork = something God has made

"But the reason the believer makes the good response is because God in His sovereign election changes the disposition of the heart of the elect to effect a good response. I can take no credit for the response that I made for Christ. God not only initiated my salvation, He not only sowed the seed, but He made sure that that seed <u>germinated</u> in my heart by regenerating me by the power of the <u>Holy Ghost</u>. That regeneration is a necessary condition for the seed to take root and to flourish....

In fact, salvation is of the Lord from beginning to end. Yes, I must believe. Yes, I must respond. Yes, I must receive Christ. But for me to say "yes" to any of those things, my heart must first be changed by the sovereign, effectual power of God the Holy Spirit. <u>Soli Deo</u> gloria."


