

Intimidation

Intimidating the Apostles...

Then seizing Jesus, they led him away and took him into the house of the high priest. **Peter** followed at a distance. And when some there had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and had sat down together, Peter sat down with them. A servant girl saw him seated there in the firelight. She looked closely at him and said, "This man was with him."

But he denied it. "Woman, I don't know him," he said.

A little later someone else saw him and said, "You also are one of them."

"Man, I am not!" Peter replied.

About an hour later another asserted, "Certainly this fellow was with him, for he is a Galilean."

Peter replied, "Man, **I don't know what you're talking about!**" Just as he was speaking, the rooster crowed. The Lord turned and looked straight at Peter. People will seize you and persecute you. They will hand you over to synagogues and put you in prison, and you will be brought before kings and governors, and all on account of my name. And so **you will bear testimony** to me. But make up your mind not to worry beforehand how you will defend yourselves. When you encounter God (like a lighthouse...) – Opposing God is foolish and futile

- When you encounter opposition to God in you (like standing in the lighthouse)...
 - Have no fear, no matter how great the power!
 - Opposing God is foolish and futile
 - "If God is for us, who can be against us?"

People, human powers, spiritual powers, human institutions, and life's troubles seem so powerful

They easily intimidate us

Yet when we stand on the rock of Jesus, no storm is too great, and no power can threaten us



Application

- When troubles intimidate and overwhelm us...
 - Stand on the solid rock of Jesus!
 - Whether sickness or relationships or finances or emotions
 - Jesus alone has the power to bring peace and wholeness
 - Beginning now
 - One day He will restore all things
 - All other ground is sinking sand

Application

- When troubles intimidate and overwhelm us...
- When our weaknesses or insignificance intimidate us...

– Stand on the solid rock of Jesus!

- Whether we lack education or degrees or position or titles or privilege or skills...
 - All of these things are like garbage compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Jesus!
- "Savior, He can move the mountains. My God is might to save!"

Application

- When troubles intimidate and overwhelm us...
- When our weaknesses or insignificance intimidate us...
- When people or powers intimidate us...
 - Stand on the solid rock of Jesus!
 - No one is small, weak, unimportant, or vulnerable, who is standing on the rock of Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit
 - Persecution is very real today for many, and it may be real tomorrow for more of us... yet our God is greater!

- When troubles intimidate and overwhelm us...

STAND ON THE SOLID ROCK OF JESUS!

- Troubles are still real. Persecution may come.
 - Yet in Jesus, we are more than conquerors!
 - One day, these momentary, light trouble will be replaced with an eternal weight of glory!
