Powerful things can come like a rogue wave or like the tide

- What powerful things come like a rogue wave?
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What is the work of God like?

When God's work is subtle and seemingly very slow, how are we tempted to respond?

Where does it seem that God is not actually working?

When the Unstoppable Arrives Luke 19:28-48

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28-34: Jesus prepared to enter Jerusalem as prophesied

- 35-38: This comes after His teaching about
- 39-40: reward for those who submitted to the new King,
- 41-44: and punishment/death for those who rejected Him
- 45-48: Luke has been preparing us for this moment

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Luke's "Journey Narrative" to Jerusalem

- •As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely **set out for Jerusalem**. *9:51*
- •Then Jesus went through the towns and villages, teaching as he **made his way to Jerusalem**. *13:22*
- •Now **on his way to Jerusalem**, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. *17:11*
- •Jesus took the Twelve aside and told them, "We are **going up to Jerusalem**, and everything that is written by the prophets about the Son of Man will be fulfilled." 18:31

•While they were listening to this, he went on to tell them a parable, because he was **near Jerusalem** and the people thought that the kingdom of God was going to appear at once. *19:11*

Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and victorious, **Iowly and riding on a donkey,** on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

Zechariah 9:9

Luke 19:28-48

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- 39-40: reward for those who submitted to the new King,
- 41-44: and punishment/death for those who rejected Him
- 45-48: Luke has been preparing us for this moment
 - Jesus intentionally fulfilled prophecy about the king coming to God's people
 - He came in humility: Creator and High King riding on a colt
 - Yet high expectations: Jesus was coming to the "center" of Judaism and His opponents


28-34: Jesus prepared to enter Jerusalem as prophesied35-38: Jesus approached Jerusalem being praised as King

- 39-40: Joyful praise by people who had seen His miracles
- 41-44: So probably people who had traveled to Jerusalem
- 45-48: with Jesus
 - Praise to the king who came in God's name (different from the parable, and the religious leaders)
 - *Like* the praise by the angels in Luke 2: "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."


Luke 19:28-48

28-34: Jesus prepared to enter Jerusalem as prophesied
35-38: Jesus approached Jerusalem being praised as King
39-40: Pharisees rebuked Jesus, yet Jesus approved of praise
41-44: • Leader is responsible for behavior of disciples
45-48: • Jesus not only allowed their praise, He said that it was right, and impossible to stop
• Jesus approved of praise of Himself as the King who was coming in the name of the Lord

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41-44: Jesus wept over Jerusalem's rejection of Him

45-48: • Jesus came to bring peace, but they rejected Him

- So complete destruction was coming "did not recognize"
 - In the year 70 AD (CE), the city and temple were destroyed, and Jewish sacrifices ended forever
- Destruction was because they rejected Jesus
- And yet Jesus wept for the people who rebelled against God and would torture & kill Jesus

"I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then **suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple**; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come," says the Lord Almighty.

But who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears? **For he will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap**. He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver; **he will purify** the Levites and refine them like gold and silver. Then the Lord will have men who will bring offerings in righteousness, and the offerings of Judah and Jerusalem will be acceptable to the Lord, as in days gone by, as in former years.

Malachi 3:1-4

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41-44: Jesus wept over Jerusalem's rejection of Him
45-48: Jesus cleared the temple and taught

- He took authority over the temple
- Purified it for its true purposes: prayer and teaching
- He taught daily until His death
- Leaders sought to kill Jesus
- People listened intently

Jesus, the Son of God, is...

humble

and compassionate

and the most powerful force in the universe.

Resisting Him ends in destruction.


Humbly trusting in Him brings life and light.

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Application

- Worship our God of humble, compassionate, and immense power
 - Jesus (the image of the invisible God) came in humility
 - Jesus invited the weak, the tired, the broken, the lowly, the sick, and the sinners and spiritually lost
 - Those who think they are healthy have no need for a doctor
 - Those who think they are fine have no need for a Savior
 - He disarmed sin and death by taking our sin upon Himself
 - He will disarm all the powers of evil

 Come to Him to find forgiveness, protection, rest, and restoration

Application

• Worship our God of humble, compassionate, and immense power

- Trust our God of humble, compassionate, and immense power
 - Thinking we can **resist** God is folly!
 - Yet we often are blind to His work, or think it isn't enough, because it is humble
 - "Who dares despise the day of small things?" Zechariah 4:10
 - The work of God may start small (like a seed), but His Kingdom is unstoppable
