
Kinds of Delayed Effects

- Incubation Period
 - Time between infection and the onset of the disease
 - Time between the disease and knowing we have it
- Gestation Period
 - Time from getting pregnant until the baby is born
 - Humans: 40 weeks
 - Elephants: 95 weeks
 - Opossum: 12 days
- What makes delayed effects challenging?

- 1-2: Greeting: blessing to 'elect exiles'

- 6-7: Exiles: not living in the land of promise
- 8-12: Scattered: who are spread out
 - 13: Vulnerable
 - Cursed
 - "You gave us up to be devoured like sheep and have scattered us among the nations."

- 1-2: Greeting: blessing to 'elect exiles'
- 3-5: Jesus' resurrection gives new birth into a living hope
- 6-7: Living hope:
- 8-12: Life-giving, even through death
 - 13: Always growing: opposite of decay and death
 - Born into a new creation and a new kingdom
 - Through Jesus' resurrection
 - Given an imperishable inheritance
 - "Ready to be revealed"
 - It is ours, but not in our possession yet

 - 13: Now: grief in various kinds of trials
 - Living in a broken world: viruses, cancer, rust
 - Living in a sinful world: injustice, evil
 - Fighting against sin in ourselves
 - Trials have benefits
 - They purify and grow our faith and souls
 - Growth through trials will bring honor in Jesus




Jesus' resurrection: Seems like the irrelevant past
