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### Context of Acts 11

The first multi-ethnic church

- Jews & Greek converts to Judaism
- Plus Greeks who never converted to Judaism

Christians

Before this church:


• Only "Jewish" people (included converts to Judaism)

Big questions in the Jewish church in Jerusalem:

- Is this church really a Christian church?
- Is this church a good thing?

To give an answer to these questions, Luke tells their story

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<sup>19</sup> Now those who had been scattered by the persecution that broke out when Stephen was killed traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus and Antioch, spreading the word only among Jews. <sup>20</sup> Some of them, however, men from Cyprus and Cyrene, went to Antioch and began to speak to Greeks also,

telling them the good news about the Lord Jesus.

21 The Lord's hand was

<sup>21</sup> The Lord's hand was with them, and a great number of people believed and turned to the Lord.



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<sup>22</sup> News of this reached the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. <sup>23</sup> When he arrived and saw what the grace of God had done, he was glad and encouraged them all to remain true to the Lord with all their hearts. <sup>24</sup> He was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and faith, and a great number of people were brought to the Lord.

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
<sup>25</sup> Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, <sup>26</sup> and when he found him, he brought him to Antioch. So for a whole year Barnabas and Saul met with the church and taught great numbers of people. The disciples were called Christians first at Antioch.

#### Acts 11:19-30

19-26: Multi-ethnic church started & grew in Antioch

- 27-30: Gospel was told to Gentiles (crossing boundaries)
  - By unnamed, "ordinary" Christians
  - Barnabas "saw what the grace of God had done"
    - New and growing Christians
    - Diverse unity
  - First ones to be called "Christians"
    - Models of what a Christian church should be
    - Because of diversity, it no longer made sense to consider it a subset of Judaism



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<sup>27</sup> During this time some prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. <sup>28</sup> One of them, named Agabus, stood up and through the Spirit predicted that a severe famine would spread over the entire Roman world. (This happened during the reign of Claudius.) <sup>29</sup> The disciples, as each one was able, decided to provide help for the brothers and sisters living in Judea. <sup>30</sup> This they did, sending their gift to the elders by Barnabas and Saul.

#### Acts 11:19-30

19-26: Multi-ethnic church started & grew in Antioch

27-30: Antioch church gave as an act of service

- The prophet Agabus told of coming need in Judea
  - The Roman world (perhaps a bad harvest in Egypt)
  - Jerusalem had no margin, so very vulnerable
    - Like many places in the world today with the coronavirus
- Generosity came from "the disciples"
  - In Acts, "disciples"=all of the Christians
  - By unnamed, "ordinary" Christians
- Generosity was related to ability
- The gift was sent to people they might never meet

## Definitely "Yes!"

## Application

- Daily living naturally draws us into ourselves, not into Jesus
  - Following Jesus is a daily choice
  - That brings transformation
- Fruitfulness & generosity come from the Spirit in us
- → Look at and listen to and follow Jesus

# Gain "compassionate knowledge" of others

- Gift of the Spirit: like prophecy through Agabus
  - Also comes through natural means (friends, travel, guests by Zoom, Facebook, news, ...)
- From Agabus, new information was a call to potential action
- → Be compassionate when you hear the news
