"By the skin of my teeth" means: To avoid disaster or to survive by a very narrow margin, "just barely"
Isaiah's context and prophecy
Zebulun & Naphtali had just been conquered
Isaiah predicted that the rest of Israel would also be conquered
Dark days (" darkness") were coming for the people of God
Ephesians 8:19-9:7
8:19-22: Without hope in God, darkness and fearful will come
9:1-3: In the land of death darkness, a has dawned
The first to fall and the least honored

"Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee" Matthew 21:11
Matthew 4 quotes this passage: Jesus brought this great light as He began His ministry in Galilee
