"Poetic Justice"

When we get to see people experience bad ("just") consequences for their risky or bad behavior

Especially when the punishment "fits" the crime

When are we upset that poetic justice doesn't happen?

 When people get away with doing the wrong we do, or wish we could do, or pride ourselves that we don't do

When do we like poetic justice?

· We people we don't like or look down on receive justice

When don't we like poetic justice?

When we are the ones receiving justice

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What do we celebrate at Christmas?

- The Son of God entered the world as a human being
- He taught us how to live
- He showed us how to live
- He gave up His life to rescue us
- He commanded us:
 - Love God with everything you have
 - Love your neighbors and your enemies as much as you love yourselves
 - Worship Him as God alone
- How are we doing??

The Apostle John's Assessment

"The true light (Jesus Christ) that gives light to everyone was coming into the world.

He was in the world,

and though the world was made through him,

the world did not recognize him.

He came to that which was his own,

but his own did not receive him."

John 1:9-11

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What does "did not recognize Him" mean?

- We do not realize (or we choose not to realize) that Jesus is God
- We do not treat Jesus as God,
 because we do not treat God as God
 - He has total authority over life and death and creation
 - · But we think our ways are better
 - He is the only one who holds life in His hands
 - But we want to control life
 - He is the one who will judge the final judgment
 - But we think we can do a better job

What does "did not recognize Him" look like?

- Being too busy to see Him or listen to Him
- Never getting around to loving Him with head, heart, and hands
- Being more concerned about what other people think of me than what Jesus thinks of me
- · Being more concerned about what I think of me than what Jesus thinks of me
- Treating Him as though He isn't strong enough or powerful enough to protect me or do what I need
- Thinking He doesn't love me enough, or that He can't love me enough, to take care of me
- Looking to other powers or sources of help instead of looking to Him
- Insulting Him with faint praise ("He helps me get through life") or insincere praise ("I bow down...")

- Each one of us so often fails to recognize Jesus as God
- Each family and group so often fails to recognize Him as God
- · Humanity has so often failed to recognize Him as God
- God came in the flesh, and we don't recognize Him as God
- What would poetic justice (and real justice) look like?
 - God rejects those who don't recognize Jesus as God
 - This is both poetic justice and real justice!
 - And it must be because God is just
- And yet...God says there is hope
- Why? Where does it come from?

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The limitless joy of perfect love and life forever growing and expanding

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

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Application

1) Receive this great love!

- It is entirely a gift flowing from the limitless love of God
- We receive it by believing in Jesus, the Son of God
 - Recognize Jesus as God
 - **Head**: believe the truth that Jesus is the only Son of God, and He is the only way to genuine and lasting life
 - **Heart**: bow before Him as God alone
 - Hands: accept His commands as our standard for life
 - Recognize Jesus as our Savior
 - He rescues and saves guilty, shameful, enslaved people
 - To be loved children of God forever
 - Who grow into the glory of their heavenly Father

Application

1) Receive this great love!

- It is not "a clean slate" or a chance to try again
- It is being adopted as a deeply loved child of God
- Forever
- Yet it is so easy to slip back into thinking God doesn't really love us, or can't really love us, unless we improve

God will never regret saving you because His love never fades and you aren't the reason He loved you in the first place!!!

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Application

1) Receive this great love!

- Some of us believe in Jesus, and yet we are still trying to earn God's love
- We want to think we can be good enough to deserve it
- Impossible!!
- Do we think so little of the love of God??

Receive God's love
entirely as a gift
for guilty, shameful, and enslaved people
who trust in Jesus as their Savior

Application

2) Love one another with this great love!

"Dear friends, let us **love one another**, for **love comes from God**. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, because **God is love**. This is how **God showed his love** among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that **he loved us** and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since **God so loved us**, we also ought to **love one another**. No one has ever seen God; but if we **love one another**, **God lives in us** and his love is made complete in us." *1 John 4:7-12*

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Application

2) Love one another with this great love!

Love others who don't deserve it with the love you got and don't deserve

- Bless those who curse you. Give to those who ask of you.
- Be patient and kind. Don't envy or boast or be proud.
- Don't dishonor others, or be self-seeking, or be easily angered, or keep track of others' wrongs.
- Don't rejoice in others' troubles or wrongs
- Rejoice in what is true and good, even when it comes to my 'enemies'
- · Always protect others' good and honor
- Always believe that there is more good in people than I can see
- Always hope for what is good and always persevere

2) Love one another with this great love!

"No one has ever seen God; but if we **love one another**, **God lives in us** and his love is made complete in us."

3) Make known this great love, by actions and words
Freely you have received. So freely give

This kind of love in action is unmistakable evidence of the presence of God

"How can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear **without someone preaching to them**?" *Romans 10:14*

Tell people, and show people, what God is like, loving people in a way they could never deserve Empowered by the Spirit of God who is love
