

The story of Daniel so far...

King Nebuchadnezzar

- Supreme ruler of the Babylonian empire, ~600 BC
- **Cp.1:** Exiles **honored God above Nebuchadnezzar**, and God honored them for it
- **Cp.2:** Nebuchadnezzar had a dream, and **only Daniel's God could explain it**
- **Cp.3:** The king demanded all to worship his statue or die **They chose to worship God**, and God rescued them

Theme: God is far greater than human kings & kingdoms even while God's people were in exile

Daniel 4

- 1-3: "God is the most high God over everyone"
 - Letter from the greatest king to all people
- 4-18: Dream: a tree and a cow → God is God over all
 - The king needed help to understand the rebuke!
- 19-27: Daniel interpreted the dream
 - And gave a warning/invitation to repent
 - God wants transformation, not just compliance
- 28-33: The king didn't change, and the dream happened
- 34-37: The king was restored, and he praised God
 - It took him 8 years to "look up"





 - "I'll lift my cup, whether full or empty, to you"
 - A vast army came to attack Israel. The king prayed:
