Jesus is the Good and Sovereign God
Fantastic blessings
come as He decides

- Sometimes He leads into suffering
- •Sometimes He blesses others more, or first, or instead of, or even by taking from us!!
- As a means to bring His fantastic blessings

Imagine that we need urgent help

- Two options:
 - We hire a new helper
 - We hire a new boss
- •What are some differences?
 - •Who sets the agenda?
 - •Who assigns the roles and tasks?

Is becoming a follower of Jesus more like getting a new helper or getting a new boss?
