
What it looked like to join Jesus...


- Lives changed

- Jesus is criticized then attacked by people who began making plans to kill Him



What it looks like...

Telling & showing that the King has come:

- Jesus is God's Son in human form
- •He has suffered so we can enter God's family
- His Spirit is in us, empowering us to work in and for His Kingdom
- "Repenting and believing" → turn and follow
 People making decisions for or against
- Being transformed for and by the King
 - Seeking His Kingdom
 - Growing in Christlikeness

What it looks like...

- It does <u>not</u> mean that...
 - everything else stops or is unimportant
 - only 'spiritual things' matter
- It does mean that everything finds its place only in how it relates to the Kingdom of God
