Ecclesiastes 3:1-15

Two great story types

Comedy: <u>ends</u> high Tragedy: <u>ends</u> low

Psalm 39:4-7

Ecclesiastes 3:1-15

1-9:

Merism: Beginning and ending includes everything in between

Cycles of activity, but no progress Chapter 1: in the natural world Chapter 3: in human experience

"Everything is frustratingly out of our control"

10-11:

An awareness of time without the power to understand it or control it is a heavy burden from God God has set eterninity in the human heart, but no one can figure it out

We know...

there is a bigger picture than here and now and we are connected to it

and there are appropriate times for things

Dogs & cats & the other animals...

don't regret the past & don't worry about the future

The past & future often dominate our present

We can't fix the past

We can't be sure what is right in the present

We can't know the future

So we struggle...

The story of humanity

Humans are made in the image of God

Made for eternity

In the Garden of Eden: Tree of Life = peace (Shalom) with eternity

Sin/rebellion spoiled the good design

Humanity expelled from the Garden of Eden

No more access to the Tree of Life

New Heaven & New Earth through Jesus: Abundant, monthly crops from Tree of Life for all who live there

12-13:

Without eternity (the Tree of Life)...

Resignation, not enthusiasm

Better to ignore time and seek happiness in the moment

Yet God controls that too

14-15:

We can't change God's design What to do? Find our place in God

Access to Eternity through Jesus

"This grace was given us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time, but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior, Christ Jesus, who has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel." 2 Timothy 1:9-10

Big Idea

Joyful, meaningful, full human life is only found in relationship with God through Jesus







We know there is a story line
But we can only see a tiny portion
"God gave us a desire for something that is well beyond our reach"
God can see it all and control it all
He invites us to 'fear' Him: admit our smallness and our need for Him

Applications

Admit our time problem

We want eternity, but can't reach it
We can't determine the times
Birth ← → Death

Is it time for grace or severity?

Yet we keep trying! [as if we could]

Rehearsing the past Fearing the future

Worrying what is appropriate for today

Or we just give up and live for today

We need help!



"Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent." *John 17:3* Jesus "has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel." *2 Timothy 1:10* He can work the **past** together for good

He holds the **future** in His hands

"...all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be." Psalm 139:16

He knows what is appropriate for **today**

And He works it all together for our good!

"For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 8:38-39

When we are troubled by time...

Remember:

Jesus said: "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End." *Revelation 22:13* God can see and manage all time

He is with us in the present

He can work the past for good

He has already worked out the future in His love
