









The Sea

Ancient Israelites were afraid of the sea

- A symbol of chaos and evil
- "Coastlands" and "Islands" meant "the ends of the earth"
- Travel by ship was very risky
 - Jonah
 - Paul

1 Kings 10:22

The king [Solomon] had a fleet of trading ships at sea along with the ships of Hiram. Once every three years it returned, carrying gold, silver and ivory, and apes and baboons.

An expression of extravagant success

- Very risky to trade by sea
- No communication for 3 years!
- But when it worked, there was a big reward

Ecclesiastes 11:1-2

¹ Ship your grain across the sea; after many days you may receive a return.
² Invest in seven ventures, yes, in eight; you do not know what disaster may come upon the land.

Maybe 7 or 8 different ships (reduce risk) Take risks, yet wisely, and you'll get a reward


Ecclesiastes 11:3-4

 ³ If clouds are full of water, Merism: they pour rain on the earth. any direction
 Whether a tree falls to the south or to the north, in the place where it falls, there it will lie.
 ⁴ Whoever watches the wind will not plant; whoever looks at the clouds will not reap.

Nature is unpredictable and unchangeable Trying to "outsmart" nature to get rid of risk doesn't work

Not planting or reaping is complete disaster!!

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The Main Point

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Luke 19:11-27

¹¹ While they were listening to this, he went on to tell them a parable, because he was near Jerusalem and the people thought that the kingdom of God was going to appear at once. ¹² He said: "A man of noble birth went to a distant country to have himself appointed king and then to return. ¹³ So he called ten of his servants and gave them ten minas. 'Put this money to work,' he said, 'until I come back.' ¹⁴ "But his subjects hated him and sent a delegation after him to say, 'We don't want this man to be our king.'

¹⁵ "He was made king, however, and returned home. Then he sent for the servants to whom he had given the money, in order to find out what they had gained with it.

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¹⁶ "The first one came and said, 'Sir, your mina has earned ten more.'

¹⁷ "Well done, my good servant!' his master replied. 'Because you have been trustworthy in a very small matter, take charge of ten cities.'

¹⁸ "The second came and said, 'Sir, your mina has earned five more.'

¹⁹ "His master answered, 'You take charge of five cities.'

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²⁰ "Then another servant came and said, 'Sir, here is your mina; I have kept it laid away in a piece of cloth. ²¹ I was afraid of you, because you are a hard man. You take out what you did not put in and reap what you did not sow.'
²² "His master replied, 'I will judge you by your own words, you wicked servant! You knew, did you, that I am a hard man, taking out what I did not put in, and reaping what I did not sow? ²³ Why then didn't you put my money on deposit, so that when I came back, I could have collected it with interest?'

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²⁴ "Then he said to those standing by, 'Take his mina away from him and give it to the one who has ten minas.'

²⁵ "Sir,' they said, 'he already has ten!' ²⁶ "He replied, 'I tell you that to everyone who has, more will be given, but as for the one who has nothing, even what they have will be taken away. ²⁷ But those enemies of mine who did not want me to be king over them—bring them here and kill them in front of me.'"

Failing to do good and obey God because of risk is...

disobedience

denying the goodness of God

"No one who hopes in you will ever be put to shame" Psalm 25:3a

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When God gives us instructions, He doesn't promise that...

- It will be easy
 - Forgiving people might hurt us
 - Loving our enemies might be costly
 - Sharing the Gospel might bring rejection
 Being generous might leave us poorer
- Although these things **might** not happen

God does promise...

- relationship with Him
- His good work, even in trouble
- eventual reward for following Him

What might God be asking us to do?

Forgive

Let go of possessions we are clinging to Love our enemies and bless those who curse us Seek help to battle a sin that keeps tripping us up Have a conversation we've been avoiding Share the Gospel with someone Change the course of our lives Use a gift from God that is new to us

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Application
