





A Spacewalk

We need...

- A space suit
- A tether
 - A source of oxygen
 - A connection to the spaceship so we don't drift away







A Spacewalk with no tether

What matters most?

- Always aware of how to get back to the spaceship
- They "<u>fear</u>" the spaceship
 - they <u>know</u> that they are entirely dependent upon getting back to the spaceship
 - always have it in mind
- Every action is tested: Is this moving me toward the spaceship or away from it?

Ask and listen: how am I to come closer?

- The command: "Come near to God and he will come near to you."

 James 4:8
- Take steps toward God = Move with God
- That is: Obey His commands
 - Love God and love people
 - Seek first His Kingdom and His ways
