### From safe to dangerous

What safe situations can become dangerous?

The world was a perfect place

Adam & Eve were vulnerable without danger

Everything was perfectly good! How did good things become bad?

Over and over again...

Pray: "Correct me"

## When trouble begins...

The book of Genesis = Beginnings The only ancient origin story where humanity goes from paradise to judgment What happened?

## Questions that matter to us that the text largely ignores

How could a serpent speak? How did the serpent (or Satan) become evil in a good creation? What would have happened if Adam & Eve never sinned? Was sin inevitable? Adam's roles? (human, man, husband, head) ...

## Genesis 2

God's beautiful design was to make people mutually dependent: Adam: guard Eve: fit helper "Adam and his wife were both naked, and they felt no shame." Genesis 2:25

# Genesis 3

## 1-7: The "Fall" (the first sin)

## 8-19: God's judgment

## 20-24: The early expressions of grace/forgiveness

"Like one of us": They acted in God's role as moral judge

## The Main Point

## The world fell from paradise to chaotic and deadly trouble when they failed in their God-given roles

Woman → Fit helper Moral judge Advocate for disobedience

Man → Guard Passive acceptance

#### Human laws

Proper authorities make laws Proper authorities enforce laws Sometimes people take over those roles

#### God's Law

God is the only one who is wise and good enough to make good laws Satan prompted Eve to question those laws...and the law giver



Eve chose to rewrite the laws (she became like God) Eve invited Adam to join her Adam didn't resist or correct or guard Their actions changed creation from being good and safe to being broken and dangerous

## Central to Sin is...

putting human judgment above divine command actively or passively, leader or follower
Judges: "In those days Israel had no king; everyone did as they saw fit." Judges 21:25
My colleague: "I will only believe what makes sense to me."

"Woe to those who are wise in their own eyes and clever in their own sight." Isaiah 5:21

# Application

## Submit to God and His commands

His commands are always an expression of His love for us He is the only one who knows what is best and most life-giving Our understanding and goodness always fall far short of God's understanding and goodness Different people have different roles **As a helper** 

Don't be an unwitting advocate for rebellion, by words or by actions Like Peter to Jesus

As a guardian

Actively guard God's teaching and ways

## Confess to God when we stray

We keep acting as though we know better than God We keep treating God as though He does not truly love us Stop hiding and come into God's presence, so He can clothe us God already knows, and is waiting for us

# A Second Adam

The first Adam failed: "many died by the trespass of the first man" The second Adam (Jesus Christ) won the victory for all who will trust in Him! "For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man many will be made righteous." Romans 5:17

# Hope in Confession

Cherubim guarded access to Tree of Life Cherubim on temple curtain guarded access to God's presence in the Holy of Holies When Jesus died, the curtain was torn in two the cherubim stepped aside and no longer prevented access to those who are in Christ! Our hope is in Christ our rescuer!
