Psalm 136

1-3:

He is God above every other power And He is good

When things are far too big for us

When being oppressed by unjust rulers for many generations!

When trapped with no way out
When they had needs they couldn't meet

17-22

When opposed by powers far too big for them

23-25

When we all are low, weak, and vulnerable

When we all face enemies

When we all have needs

... His love is always there!!

The Big Idea

God's steadfast love is always strong and new to all God's people

The psalmist tells us to thank God for good that He did for others of His people Why?

C.S. Lewis on Faith

Faith is Belief

Not: convincing yourself to believe something that has little evidence

<u>Rather</u>: continuing to believe what I have become convinced of, even when my emotions and imagination oppose it

"Jesus loves me" is such a simple idea! Yet our emotions often oppose believing it To grow in faith...

The soul must be fed the truth continually

Especially of God's unending love

"That is why daily prayer and religious (Scripture) reading and church-going (and small groups) are necessary parts of the Christian life."

It helps build an unshakable confidence in God's unending love

We grow in our confidence in God's presence and provision for those...

who are enduring persecution and oppression who endured hardship of various kinds who sought to be salt & light in the world who are seeking first His Kingdom who are suffering for His Name

Application

Thank God for His love that we experience

Directly: "Thank you God" Specifically: "Thank you for..." Sincerely: from your heart Regularly: for our "daily bread"

Specially: Thanksgiving and special gifts

Empathetically: remembering those who aren't experiencing this goodness now

Thank God for His love in the lives of His people

"I always thank my God for you because of his grace given you in Christ Jesus." 1 Corinthians 1:4

For our ancestors and relatives

For His people we aren't related to

...who experienced the goodness we long for

It builds the unity of God's people It grows our faith in God's love

Thank God by faith for His love that we can't yet see

2 Corinthians 12:9-10

When we have faith in God in our difficulties, His power is made complete in our weakness

We experience a measure of God's love when we thank God for it by faith

So thank Him in the very places where we need to experience His love

On Thanksgiving

Use a real portion of your time on Thanksgiving...

To thank God directly, specifically, sincerely, and empathetically

For the good you have experienced and are experiencing now

For the good others have experienced, in the past and in the present

For the good you don't have yet but that God has promised
